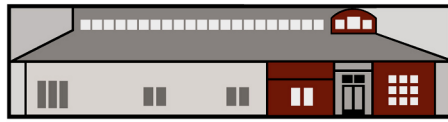


There are many (simple) ways you can help the Newbury Town Library!

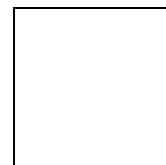
Recycle your paper at the Library

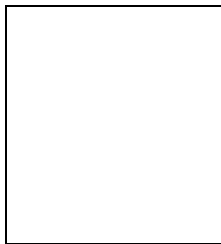

Honor a birthday, anniversary, or the memory of someone by giving a gift book donation to the Newbury Town Library. Your gift will benefit the community for years to come while adding a personalized touch to your giving. The book may reflect the interests of the giver or of the person in whose memory the gift is given. If you do not wish to indicate a specific subject, the library will select a book for you. Local organizations and clubs are welcome to donate to a special area of the collection based on their interests, such as business, health, or local history.

The donor and person or family being honored will be sent an acknowledgement of the gift. A bookplate will be placed on the donated item with the name of the honoree.
